The following report outlines the activity of the Medicine Lodge Police Department for the month of May, 2016:

### CALLS FOR SERVICE / CASES

The Medicine Lodge Police Department responded to or initiated 132 service calls during the month of May which resulted in 21 police reports being generated.

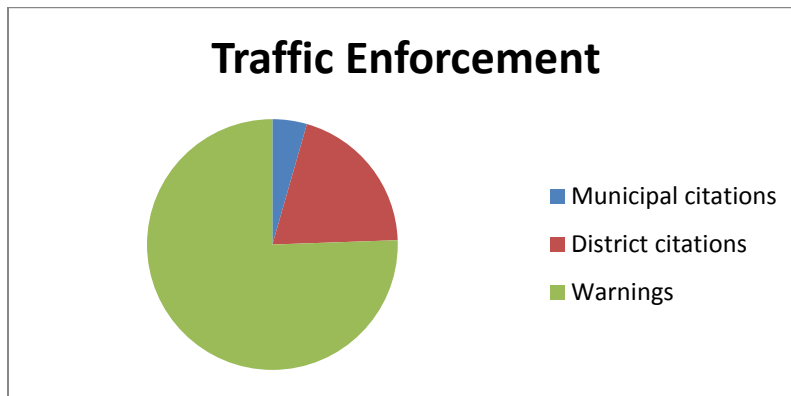
\*Criminal reports may contain multiple offenses, resulting in the total number of offenses / crimes being greater than the number of criminal reports.

**TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT**

The Medicine Lodge Police Department conducted 35 traffic stops during the month of May.

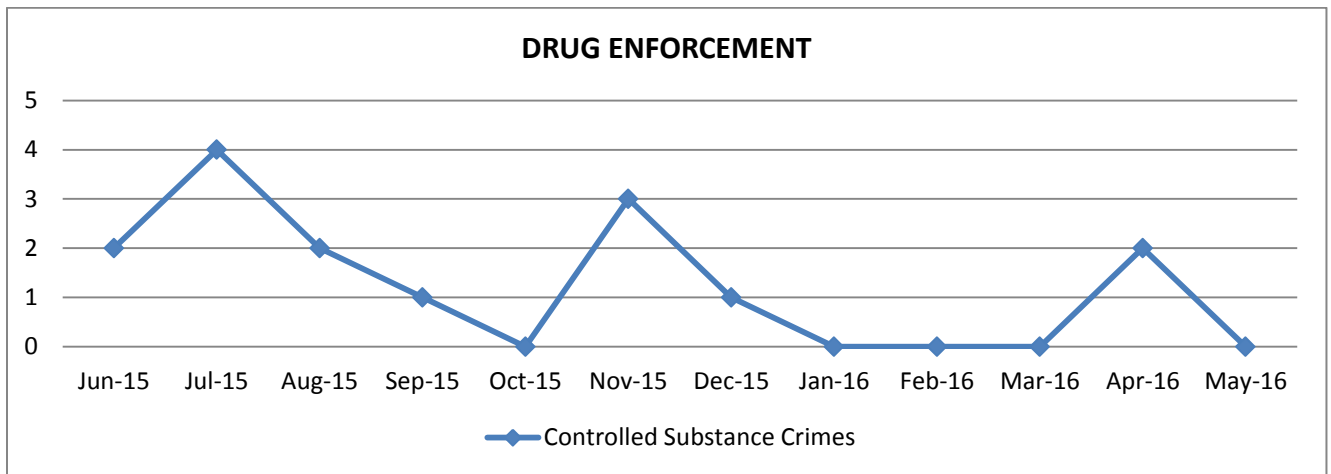
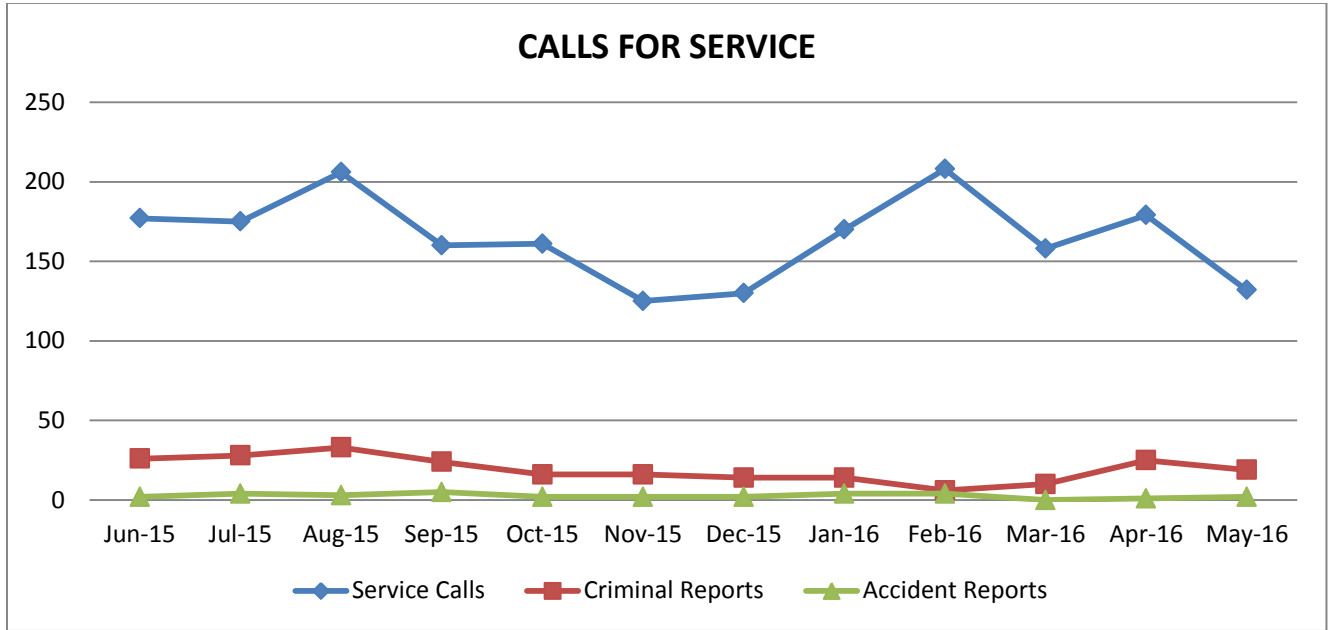
“Citizen Contacts” are defined as any contact with citizens in a non-investigatory manner. It includes officer-initiated and citizen-initiated contact. If the contact turns into a call for service or a case, it should not be counted as a citizen contact. Citizen contacts are a conversation with a citizen which does not require any follow-up investigation.

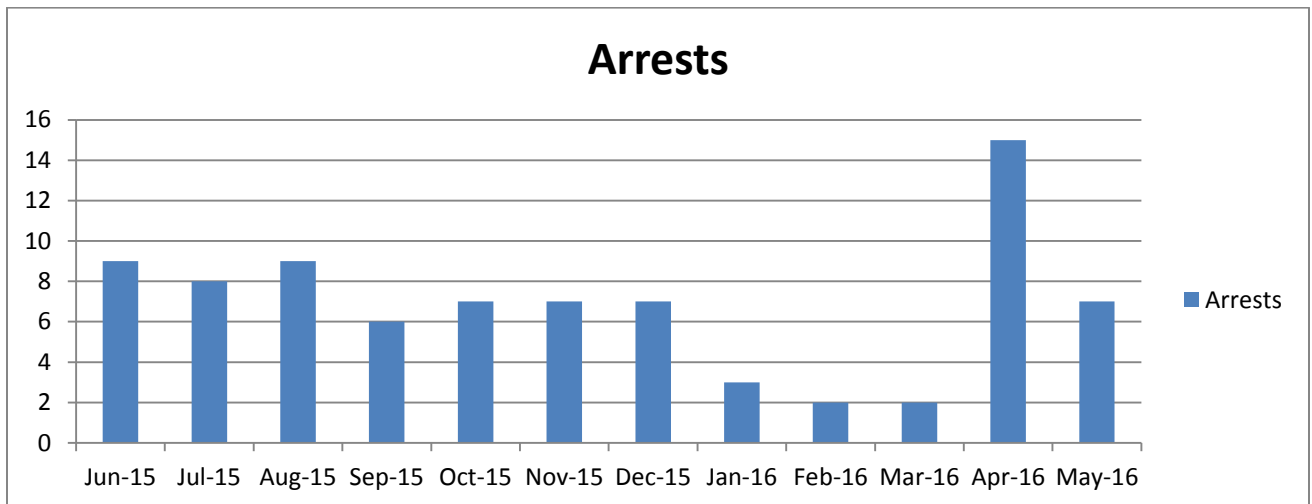
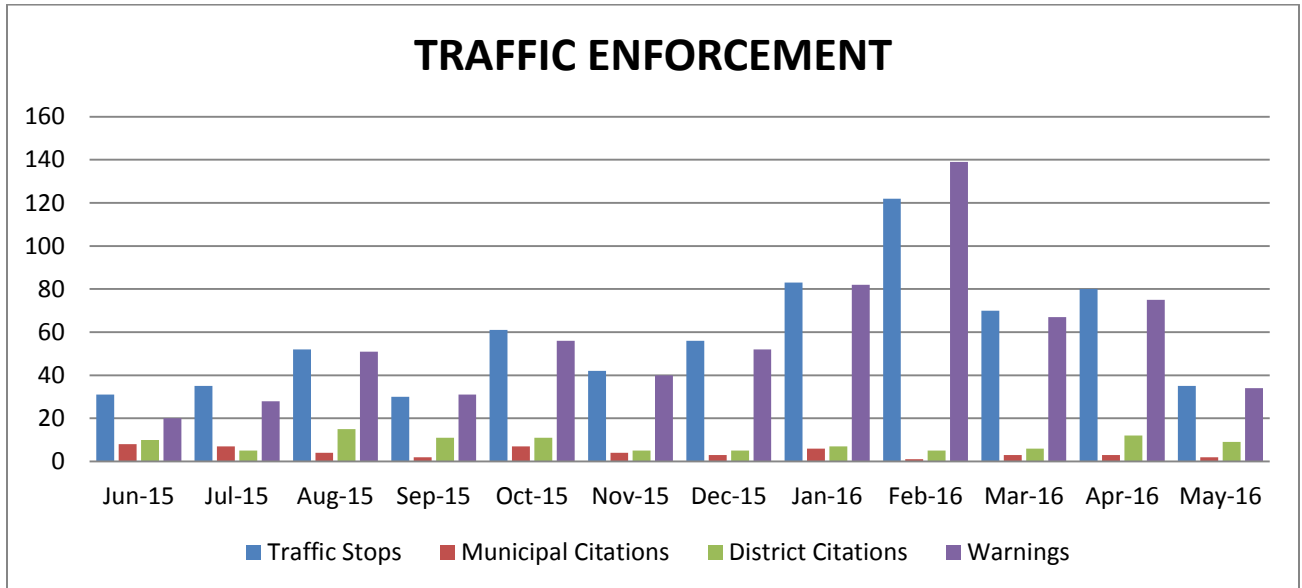
“Investigative Contacts” are defined as any reasonable suspicion or consent based citizen contact that is of an investigative nature. If self-initiated, it should also be logged as a call for service. If the contact is initiated because of a dispatched call, the incident should only be logged as a call for service.

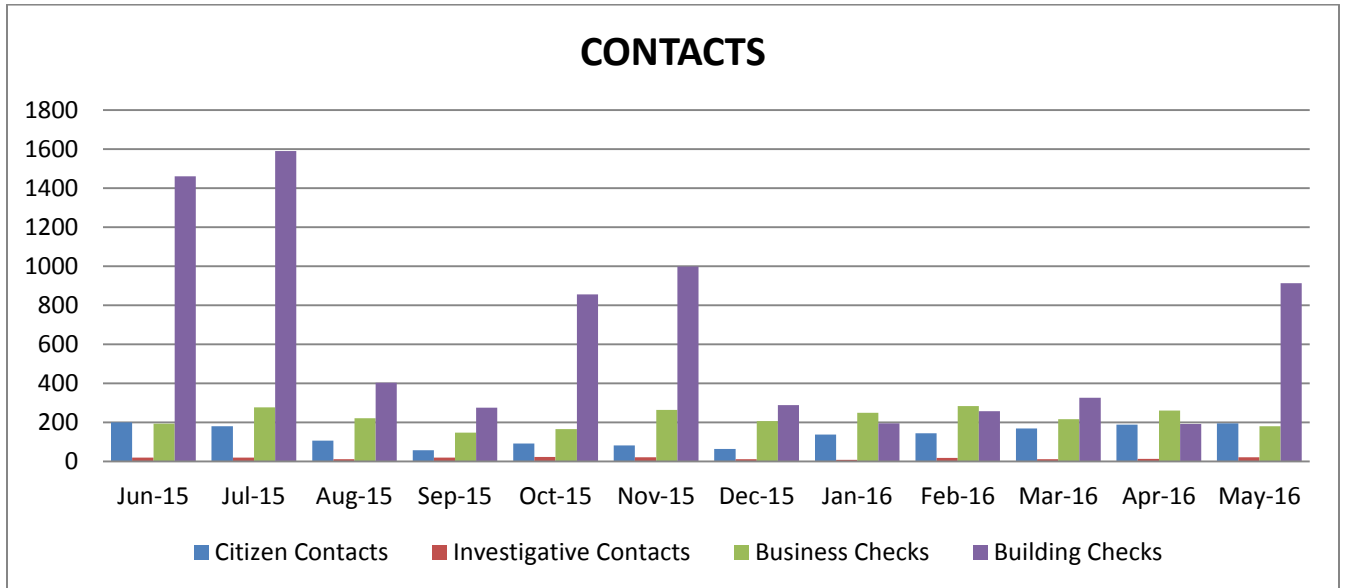
“Business Checks” are defined as any self-initiated check or walk-through of a business which is open to the public.

“Building Checks” are defined as any self-initiated security check of a closed business or unoccupied residence.
